Course catalogue

We offer a wide range of degree programs (1st and 2nd cycle) on three different campuses located in Florence (Architecture), Calenzano (Design), and Prato (Urban Planning).

In particular, we have 4 Bachelor Degrees (Laurea TRIENNALE), 5 Master Degrees (Laurea MAGISTRALE), and one 5-years Degree program (Laurea a CICLO UNICO).

All of the degree programs are carried out in Italian, except for the following two Master's programs, which are entirely taught in English:

- International Curriculum in Architectural Design (ICAD);
- Urban and Regional Planning and Design for Sustainability.

These English-taught courses cannot grant acceptance to all incoming students, so that they very often have to switch to Italian classes: therefore, we strongly recommend the knowledge of the Italian language for everyone.

**Note that they do not release a final mark: only a “passed” or “failed” evaluation.*

Subjects from different years and different courses degrees can be chosen. Please, note that, while all subjects are open, most of “Laboratorio” has limited places. Make sure that you have more options, in case your registration will not be accepted.

CLA (University Linguistic Center)

Incoming students are offered one Italian language course* free of charge at Centro Linguistico di Ateneo (CLA), located in Via Degli Alfani 58. Registration is needed [here](#).

Application

After the official nomination from the home University, students will receive an e-mail from the International Relations Office with all the instructions on the application process.

Students have to provide the following documents:

- Enrolment Form
- Language Certification
- Learning Agreement
- copy of passport or national identity card

> Enrolment Form

It is a document with basic personal data and information about previous and current studies. It can be downloaded from the [Forms section](#) on our website.

> Language requirements

All incoming students need to apply with:

Certified **B1 of Italian** mandatory to attend courses held in Italian
AND/OR

Certified **B2 of English** mandatory to attend courses held in English

B1 of Italian is strongly recommended for everyone!

> Learning Agreement

Learning Agreement is a document which contains the list of activities at the University of Florence.

How to fill in the Learning Agreement:

1. search the Course Catalogue for next academic year;
2. fill in your OLA (Online Learning Agreement) through the home institution online platform, or, if not applicable, send via e-mail the LA form (.pdf), which can be downloaded from the [Forms section](#) on our website.

When listing the subject in your learning agreement, please, make sure that the code is for the correct academic year you are applying for.

3. get the approval/signature from your home university;
4. after the application is completed, the International Relations Office will approve it and sign it.



Preliminary web-registration

Learning Agreement Change

Learning Agreement can be changed within 6 weeks after the start of the semester. Incoming students can make their request of change ONLINE (through the home institution online platform) or, if not applicable, sending via e-mail to archint@unifi.it the pdf form (see the [Forms section](#)) signed and sealed from the home institution.

Extension of the study period

Exchange students can ask for an extension of their mobility period no later than one month before the end of their mobility. They must send a request, signed and sealed from the home institution, by email to archint@unifi.it. The form can be downloaded from the [Forms section](#).

At the End of the Mobility

Check out

Before checking out, all incoming students should check on Unifi [Gestione Carriera Studenti \(GCS\)](#) if all the taken examinations have been recorded.

Mind that the updates may not be immediate, because professors might need some time to finalize the registration of the exams.

Check out is not in charge of the International Relations Office.

> Erasmus Students

Erasmus students have to fill out the "esami sostenuti" form (rtf - pdf), and send it to **Erasmus Desk***. Further information is available on the [website](#).

> Exchange Students

Exchange students have to write to **International Desk*** and they will send instructions on the check out. Further information is available on the [website](#).

> Transcript of Records & Certificate of Stay

Incoming students and their home institutions will receive the final documents by email only once the check out is completed.

Italian university grading system

The University of Florence is a public university. The "credit" system in Italian courses is based on university credits (CFU) that are equivalent to ECTS credits. A full-time student conventionally undertakes an academic workload of 60 credits per year.

Exams at the University of Florence are graded on a scale of up to 30 points, with 18/30 marking the minimum passing grade. Exceptional performance may be recognized with the distinction of "cum laude" (30 cum laude).

The University of Florence offers more than 250 programmes, with courses at all levels and in all disciplinary areas:

- First cycle (Bachelor Degree; First level professional and vocational master).
- Second cycle (Master Degree and 5-year combined cycle degrees; Second level professional and vocational master).
- Third cycle (PhD programmes, specialization diploma and other post-graduate courses).

Accommodation

UNIFI does not arrange accommodation for incoming students. However, the Regional Authority for University Services (DSU) , who supports students' lodging needs, can sometimes provide accommodation in its own facilities. Students can contact the DSU through the [Sportello studente](#): they have to register and then insert their requests.

Codice Fiscale (Tax Code)

Incoming students might need Italian tax code to rent a flat, to open a bank account, to register for Italian health system, etc.
Please find [here](#) the instructions for the request.

Residence Permit

Non-EU citizens must be in possession of a valid passport and, where required, entry visa for study purposes.

Within 8 days of entry into Italy, non-EU citizens with a mobility period of more than 90 days, must also request the residence permit: they have to fill in a kit provided by a [Post Office](#) and keep carefully the three request's receipts they obtain as proof of the application.

Medical Service

Italian public sanitary system is called Servizio Sanitario Nazionale (SSN). Those who are registered to SSN have the same rights and duties of Italian citizens including the co-payment of fees for the services provided (ticket). The contribution varies according to the financial situation of the applicant. In some cases, (e.g. students) applicants pay a flat fee.
