Q&A regarding the AAAS Green OA Policy

Q [TIB]: AAAS makes the following statement re. the Green OA Policies for the five *Science* family subscription journals: “*These green open access policies have long meant that authors could place their accepted manuscript in an institutional repository or on their personal website immediately upon publication, and on 1 January, 2023, we expanded this even further; authors of peer-reviewed research may now place their accepted manuscript in a repository of their choice immediately upon publication.*” Does this entail all peer-reviewed articles / all types of research?

A [AAAS]: Yes, the author accepted manuscript (AAM) of peer-reviewed research and analysis articles (Policy Articles and Analytical Reviews) can be submitted to a repository of the author’s choice immediately upon publication. Authors of commentary articles can post the AAM to their personal website or institutional repository.

Q [TIB]: Are there restrictions to where the author is based or what role the author has (corresponding author, co-author)?

A [AAAS]: No.

Q [TIB]: Are there restrictions to what kind of repository is permissible? I.e. are public repository / commercially run repositories etc. included?

A [AAAS]: The policy was written to focus on repositories that are openly accessible to the general public. Closed or restricted access repositories may be permitted case to case.

Q [TIB]: Just to double-check: The option to put a CC BY license on the AAM is only available to cOAlition S-funded authors and other authors whose funders require a CC BY license, correct?

A [AAAS]: That is correct. There must be a clear mandate/requirement that the AAM must be made available for further use under a CC BY license.

Q [TIB]: How does AAAS monitor compliance?

A [AAAS]: We do not monitor compliance.
